NHCO Awarded \$240,000 Challenge Grant

The **Kresge Foundation** has awarded NHCO a \$240,000 Challenge Grant for the Millvale Satellite Expansion project, a collaborative effort with the Borough of Millvale to renovate and expand the existing community center and move our Satellite there. Of course, there's a catch! We need to raise an additional \$550,000 in local donations in order to get that money. It's a challenge, not a match, and every gift we receive for the expansion counts towards it.

Construction Progress

Mild weather throughout most of the winter allowed the exterior excavation and cement work to proceed right on schedule. Nine windows donated by **Jim Rogerson** and **Pittsburgh Window and Door** of Millvale were installed along the east wall on the second floor, and several other interior walls were demolished and reconfigured.

Placement of cement block that forms the exterior walls of the new portion of the building along Lincoln Avenue went without a hitch. Structural steel and pre-cast cement decking for the second floor were put in place in March. A new roof was placed on the entire building in May, and plumbing and electric work is well under way.

June through September we will focus on the interior of the building, such as drywall, painting, floors, ceiling tiles, telephone systems, computers and furnishings. It is during this time that we hope to incorporate as many volunteers as possible.

Special thanks to **Landau Building Company** Project Manager **Steve Bishop** and Superintendent **Jeff Bono**, who have done an outstanding job at keeping the project on budget and on schedule for a projected October opening.

AmeriCorps Arrives and Everyone Pitches In!

Eleven dedicated **AmeriCorps*NCCC Members** recently spent three weeks working on the project (NHCO was one of only a few organizations to be granted a team this year due to ongoing Gulf Coast recovery efforts). **LaRoche College** donated dorm rooms to house the Corps Members, and the **Sisters of St. Francis of Millvale** donated lunches each day.

Meals were also donated by local businesses, including **Amato's Pizza**, **Hong Kong Taste**, the **Grant Bar**, **P&G Diner**, and **Remos' Catering**.

After a thorough introduction to NHCO, the enthusiastic Corps Members worked with **Linkrist Construction** to muscle several hundred sheets of drywall into place. **John Puhr** at **Triangle Fastener Corporation** donated enough 1¼-inch

self-tapping drywall screws to apply 500 sheets of drywall. **Winschel Hardware** in Etna donated a power sander that was used to refinish the donated doors, and **Hastings Hardware** of Millvale worked with **MEDRAD** to provide other miscellaneous tools and supplies used by Corps Members during their stay.

Materials and Volunteers Still Needed

Several doors donated by **AUMA Actuators** need to be refinished by volunteers in June and will be installed later in the summer. NHCO requests donations of wood and metal stripping supplies such as liquid stripper, power sanders, sandpaper, sanding blocks, steel wool and foam brushes for stain and polyurethane applications.

NHCO is also responsible for painting the bulk of the interior. Painting work is tentatively scheduled for late July and early August. Much of the paint to be used in the new NHCO offices was donated by **Westmoreland Supply** in the Strip District, but we still need brushes, rollers, extensions and a few ladders.

In September, we will need volunteers to help install cabinets and countertops in our volunteer workroom and conference room. We will also need assistance moving items from storage into our new space. Finally, we need lunches for our dedicated volunteers.

Scholarship Recipient Graduates

Bellevue resident Kathy Dragone is a single mother of two teenage boys. Her job as a full-time secretary for the Northgate school district inspired her to become an elementary teacher. She moved one step closer to that goal on May 6, when she graduated from LaRoche College with a degree in elementary education (and a 4.0 GPA). Kathy was able to achieve this dream thanks in part to \$4,000 in scholarships granted by NHCO and funded by [Zonta Three Rivers North](#).

In her scholarship application essay, Kathy wrote, "I see the need to teach our kids self-esteem and self-worth. Receiving this scholarship will help me to achieve my goal of bringing hope to the children who need it."

While student teaching, Kathy was unable to work and needed a little extra help. Utilizing a holistic approach to helping people in need, NHCO provided additional assistance with seasonal sharing projects as well as utility help.

This past spring term, 14 nontraditional students received NHCO scholarships totaling \$10,472. This program is funded entirely by local businesses like [Alicia Photography](#), civic groups and individuals. Donors who contribute at least \$1,000 can name their scholarship and specify requirements for recipients. Volunteers are needed to assist with fundraising for the scholarship program. Two Programs Help Individuals Become Self-Sufficient

Starting in July, NHCO will offer computer literacy classes, thanks to funding from the [Allegheny County Department of Human Services](#). The **Computer Literacy and Employment Program** (CLEP) will incorporate computer literacy instruction with job search strategies. The program will also offer training in customer service skills, time management, resumé writing and interviewing. Skilled volunteers are needed to help conduct the computer trainings.

Sixteen women participated in the most recent **New Choices** program at NHCO, which helps women transitioning into new careers or into the workplace for the first time. A variety of topics were covered during this ten-week program, including skill and interest testing, interviewing, stress management and networking. This program was provided by [PA Women Work!](#).

The **Free Rides for Seniors** program—part of **Faith in Action Hartwood**—began in May 2005. Since then, we have provided more than 7,200 rides to 284 local senior citizens (statistics as of April).

Volunteer drivers provide free transportation along Freeport Road between Blawnox and Sharpsburg to doctor and dentist appointments, grocery or drugstore, hair salon or lunch with friends. Regular riders are making friends with each other and with our caring bus drivers and dispatchers. This free transportation program is a wonderful opportunity for fun and fellowship.

Making Vehicle Ownership a Reality

More transportation news at NHCO! Our partnership with **Community Auto** is proving to be an effective way to get donated vehicles into the ownership of low-income workers at prices far below market value. On average, each month five vehicles are donated, repaired and sold to help local individuals obtain or maintain employment and tend to other family needs.

Among the 15 people who have purchased cars this year is April, a single mother living in Ross Township. She is a full-time nursing student and needed a safe, reliable vehicle to get to school and eventually look for a job. April purchased a 1994 Ford Taurus at a savings of 34% off retail value to help her finish her schooling and continue into the nursing profession. This vehicle was donated by an NHCO supporter, and April herself was referred to Community Auto through NHCO.

April is so pleased with the compassionate and professional treatment she received that she has referred several people to Community Auto.

Community Auto can be even MORE effective with the help of volunteers who can make basic repairs to vehicles. Can you help?

Reaching Out to Stop and Prevent Tobacco Use

Smoking cigarettes hurts your health and your pocketbook, and it also negatively impacts the health of your loved ones. It is estimated that secondhand smoke inhalation is responsible for 40,000 lung cancer and cardiovascular disease deaths every year (*American Cancer Society*).

NHCO's **Tobacco Free North** program, funded by **Tobacco Free Allegheny** and the **PA Dept. of Health**, is a great resource for helping at-risk youth, low-income adults, pregnant women and others stop smoking and using other tobacco products.
